Recruitment to the posts of Assistant Director, (Research), OWS (R & T), Group-B under ST & SC Development Department.

Online applications are invited from the prospective candidates through the proforma application to be made available on the Website of the Commission (<http://opsconline.gov.in>) from 20.02.2019 to 19.03.2019 (Note: 26.03.2019 is the last date for payment of application fees) for recruitment to the posts of Assistant Director, (Research), OWS (R & T), Group-B under SCSTRTI, Bhubaneswar in the scale of pay Rs.44,900/- in Level-10, Cell-1 of ORSP, 2017 with usual Dearness and other Allowances as may be sanctioned by the Government of Odisha from time to time.

2. VACANCY POSITION :

As per requisition filed by the Directorate of SCSTRTI, under ST & SC Development Department, Government of Odisha, the vacancy position along with reservation thereof is as given below :

- NOTE:** (a) Exchange of reservation between Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe will not be considered.
- (b) In case of non-availability or availability of insufficient number of eligible/suitable women candidates belonging to the respective category, the vacancies of that category shall be filled up by eligible suitable male candidate(s) of the same category.
- (c) The number of vacancies to be filled up on the basis of this recruitment is subject to change by Government without notice, depending upon the exigencies of public service at the discretion of the State Government.

3. AGE :

A candidate must have attained the age of 21 (Twenty one) years and must not be above 32 (Thirty two) years as on 1st day January, 2019 i.e. he/she must have been born not earlier than 2nd January, 1987 and not later than 1st January, 1998.

The upper age limit prescribed above shall be relaxable by 5(five) years for candidates belonging to the categories of Scheduled Castes (S.C.), Scheduled Tribes (S.T.), Socially & Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC), Women and Ex-servicemen and by cumulative 10(Ten) years for candidates belonging to Physically Handicapped category, whose permanent disability is 40% and more.

Provided that, a candidate who comes under more than one category mentioned above, he/she will be eligible for only one age relaxation benefit, which shall be considered most beneficial to him/her.

SAVE AS PROVIDED ABOVE THE AGE LIMITS PRESCRIBED CAN IN NO CASE BE RELAXED.

Date of birth entered in the High School Certificate or equivalent certificate issued by the concerned Board/Council will only be accepted by the Commission.

4. EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION :

A Master's Degree in Anthropology/Tribal Studies/Sociology/Social Work/Applied Economics from a University or Institution recognized by Government with at least 60% marks.

5. EXAMINATION FEE :

A candidate is required to pay a non-refundable and non-adjustable fee of **Rs.500/-** (Rupees five hundred) only. Candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe of Odisha and Persons With Disability (whose permanent disability is 40% and more) are exempted from payment of this fee.

The candidates are required to take a printout of finally submitted Online Application Form for future use and take a printout of Online Challan (Pay-in-Slip) for payment of requisite fee at any branch of State Bank of India (SBI). The fee(s) paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances nor can the fee(s) be adjusted or held in reserve for any other examination or recruitment.

6. **METHOD OF SELECTION :**

The selection of candidates for recruitment to the posts will be made on the basis of Career marking, Written Examination and Viva Voce test.

The Commission will shortlist the candidates to be called for Viva Voce test to a reasonable number taking into consideration the marks secured in the written examination and career mark taking together above the cut off point to be fixed by the Commission.

The broad outlines of the pattern and syllabus etc. for the said examination are appended in this Advertisement (Schedule and Annexure-I to VI).

7. **OTHER ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS :**

- (i) A candidate must be a citizen of India;
- (ii) A candidate must be able to read, write and speak Odia and have –
 - (a) Passed Middle School Examination with Odia as a language subject; or
 - (b) Passed Matriculation or equivalent examination with Odia as medium of examination in non-language subject; or
 - (c) Passed in Odia as language subject in the final examination of Class-VII or above; or
 - (d) Passed a test in Odia in Middle English School Standard conducted by the School and Mass Education Department.
- (iii) A candidate must be of good mental condition and bodily healthy and free from any physical defect that is likely to interfere with the discharge of his duties in the service. A candidate, who after such medical examination is not found to satisfy these requirements, shall not be appointed to the service.
- (iv) A candidate, who has more than one spouse living, will not be eligible for appointment unless the State Government has exempted his/her case from operation of this limitation for any good and sufficient reasons;
- (v) If a candidate has at any time, been debarred for a certain period/chance(s) by the Odisha Public Service Commission or other State Public Service Commission or U.P.S.C. from appearing at any examination/interview, he/she will not be eligible for such recruitment for that specified period/chance(s);
- (vi) Government servants, whether temporary or permanent, are eligible to apply provided that they possess the requisite qualification and are within the prescribed age-limit as provided under Para-3&4 of the Advertisement. They must inform their respective Heads of Offices in writing regarding submission of their applications for this recruitment and obtain “No Objection Certificate”.

- (vii) A candidate who claims change in his/her name after having passed the High School Certificate Examination or equivalent examination, is required to furnish copy of publication of the changed name in local leading daily news paper as well as copy of notification in the Odisha Gazette in support of his/her change of name.
- (viii) Every candidate selected for appointment shall be examined by the Medical Board as prescribed by the Government. A candidate, who fails to satisfy the Medical Board, shall not be appointed;
- (ix) Only those candidates, who fulfil the requisite qualification and are within the prescribed age limit etc. by the closing date of filling up of online application, will be considered eligible.

8. **IMPORTANT POINTS :**

- (i) At present, only the online applications are invited from candidates for admission to the written examination for the post of Assistant Director (Research). After declaration of result of written examination, the candidates who qualify in the written examination will be required to submit the printout/hard copy of online application form, along with the photocopies of the other documents as stated under the Para – 9 of this advertisement and original of the same on the date of verification of original certificates/documents, which will be declared later on in due course, for consideration of their eligibility for admission to the Viva Voce test.
- (ii) A candidate found guilty of seeking support for his/her candidature by offering illegal gratification or applying pressure on any person connected with the conduct of the recruitment process or found indulging in any type of malpractice in course of the selection or otherwise, shall, in addition to rendering himself/herself liable to criminal prosecution, be disqualified not only for the recruitment for which he/she is a candidate, but also may be debarred, either permanently or for a specified period, from any recruitment or selection to be conducted by the Commission.
- (iii) The provisions of the Odisha Conduct of Examination Act 1988 (Odisha Act-2 of 1988) are applicable to the examination conducted by the Odisha Public Service Commission.
- (iv) Online applications submitted to OPSC if found to be incomplete in any respect are liable to rejection without entertaining any correspondence with the applicants on that score;
- (v) Admission to Written Examination/Viva Voce test will be provisional. If on verification at any stage before or after Examination / Viva Voce test, it is found that a candidate does not fulfill all the eligibility conditions or has furnished incorrect information/data, his/her candidature will be liable to rejection. Decision of the Commission in regard to eligibility or otherwise of candidate shall be final.

- (vi) This advertisement should not be construed as binding on the Government to make appointment;
- (vii) Concessions meant for S.Cs. S.Ts. & S.E.B.Cs by Birth are admissible to the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes. Such Castes/Tribes should be gazetted by the Government of Odisha and supported by a certificate issued by the competent authority.
- (viii) Candidates are required to take due care to annex the printout/hard copy of online applications, the copies of certificates and other requisite documents as stated under Para-9 of this advertisement.
- (ix) **Any misrepresentation or suppression of information by the candidate in the online application form will result in cancellation of his/her candidature or penalty, as may be decided by the Commission be imposed on the candidate.**
- (x) All persons appointed under the Government of Odisha on or after 1st January, 2005 shall not be eligible for pension as defined under sub-rule(1) of Rule-3 of the Odisha Civil Service (Pension) Rules, 1992; but shall be covered by the defined contribution pension scheme in accordance with the Odisha Civil Services (Pension) Amendment Rules 2005.
- (xi) Mere empanelment in the select list shall not confer any right for appointment unless the Government is satisfied after making such enquiry as may be deemed necessary that the candidate is suitable in all respects for appointment to the service.
- (xii) Candidates must answer the papers in their own handwriting. In no circumstances, a candidate will be allowed the help of a scribe to write the answers for him/her.
- (xiii) If one candidate furnishes more than one application, the Commission will consider the information / data of the latest application having higher ID Number.

9. CERTIFICATES/DOCUMENTS TO BE ATTACHED :

Candidates those who are called for the Viva Voce test will be required to bring with them the hard copy of online application form, along with copies of certificates, mark sheets etc. and original of the same for verification prior to the date of Viva Voce test which will be notified later on in due course, failing which he/she shall not be allowed to appear at the Viva Voce test. The candidates are required to mention on copy of each document "Submitted by me" and put their full signature and date on the same.

- (i) H.S.C. or equivalent certificate in support of declaration of age issued by the concerned Board/Council;
- (ii) Intermediate/+2 Examination Certificate issued by the concerned Board/Council;
- (iii) Degree Certificate from recognised University;
- (iv) Post Graduation Certificate in any of the subjects issued by the recognized University/Institution;

- (v) Mark-sheets in support of all the aforesaid Examination (H.S.C. to Post Graduation) passed including fail marks, if any, issued by the concerned Board / Council / University.

NOTE-1 : (a) Candidates who have not been awarded percentage of marks, but only “GRADE MARKS”, should, along with their applications, produce the conversion certificate from the concerned University indicating the actual equivalent percentage of marks and the conversion formula failing which, their applications are liable to be rejected.

(b) While filling up the marks in the online application form, the candidate has to mention the actual marks secured by him/her in the H.S.C./+2, Degree, etc. (excluding the marks secured in the Extra Optional subjects).

- (vi) Two recent passport size photographs (unsigned & unattested) which has been uploaded with Online Application Form.
- (vii) Caste Certificate **by birth** in support of claim as ST/SC/SEBC, issued by competent authority.
- (viii) Aadhaar Card.
- (ix) Required Odia Pass Certificate wherever applicable;
- (x) Discharge Certificate of Ex-Serviceman issued by the Commanding Officer of the Unit last served. Ex-servicemen must submit an affidavit that he has not been appointed against any civil post after retirement from military service.
- (xi) Identity Card of Sportspersons issued by the Director of Sports, Odisha, wherever applicable;
- (xii) OPSC copy of Challan showing payment of examination fees, wherever applicable;
- (xiii) If a candidate claims to possess qualification, equivalent to the prescribed qualification, the rule/authority (With number and date) under which it is so treated, must be furnished with the Application Form.

NOTE-2: Candidates claiming to be belonging to ST/SC/SEBC Category by birth are required to submit copy of the relevant Caste Certificate issued by the competent authority in the prescribed form.

Women candidates belonging to ST/SC/SEBC Categories are required to submit Caste Certificates by birth showing “daughter of” Caste Certificates by virtue of marriage (i.e. showing “wife of”) is not acceptable. O.B.C. certificate will **NOT BE ACCEPTED** in lieu of SEBC certificate.

The competent authorities are :- District Magistrate / Collector or Additional District Magistrate or Sub-divisional Magistrate/Sub-Collectors or Executive Magistrates or Revenue Officers, not below the rank of Tahasildar / Additional Tahasildar of Government of Odisha;

NOTE-3: Degree Certificate, Caste Certificate, Discharge Certificate of Ex-Serviceman, Sports Certificate & Odia Test Pass Certificate must have been issued by the competent authority within the last date fixed for receipt of online application form as indicated above;

(xiv) If one candidate furnishes more than one application, the Commission will consider the information/data of latest application having higher ID Number.

10. GROUND OF REJECTION OF APPLICATION :-

Applications of candidates will be rejected on any of the following grounds :-

- (a) In-complete online application form.
- (b) Non-receipt of hard copy of online application form at the time of verification of original documents.
- (c) Declaration not signed (full signature) by the candidate in the hard copy of online application form.
- (d) Age limit of candidate not coming under Para-3 of the Advertisement.
- (e) No required educational qualification as provided under Para-4 of the Advertisement.
- (f) Not furnished copies of certificates/documents as provided under Para-9 of Advertisement.
- (g) Odia Test (M.E. standard) not passed / Odia Test pass evidence not furnished as required under Para 7(ii) of the Advertisement.
- (h) Non-payment of examination fee, (wherever applicable), as provided under Para-5 of the Advertisement.
- (i) Submission of wrong information / false information about qualification / Age / O.T. Pass evidence / Category Status (S.T./S.C./ Women/Sports Persons / Ex-Serviceman etc.).
- (j) Suppression of facts / information about eligibility, if any.
- (k) Any other ground as per the decision of the Commission.

- b. Candidates must apply online through the concerned Website of the OPSC <http://opsconline.gov.in>. Applications received through any other mode would not be accepted and summarily be rejected.

- c. Before filling up the online application form, the candidates must go through the following documents available at OPSC portal.
- i) Instruction to fill up online application.
 - ii) Guidelines for scanning and Uploading the Photograph, Full Signature & Left Thumb Impression.
- d. Candidates are requested to upload the scanned image of latest passport size photograph along with scanned image of his/her full signature and scanned image of Left hand Thumb Impression(LTI) in the online application form. Uploaded photograph, Specimen (full) signature and LTI must be clearly identifiable / visible, otherwise the application of the candidate is liable to be rejected by the Commission and no representation from the candidate will be entertained.
- e. Candidates should keep at least two copies of latest passport size photograph which is uploaded to the online application form for future use.
- f. On successful submission of the online application form, a Unique Registration ID will be displayed on the screen as well as on the top of the application form. Candidates are required to take printout of the finally submitted online application form and put his/her signature under the declaration. The shortlisted candidates should submit the same to OPSC along with copies of requisite certificate and documents at the time of verification of original documents which will be notified later on in due course.
- g. The candidates are advised to submit the Online Application Form well in advance without waiting for the closing date to avoid last hour rush.
- h. Intimation Letter for the V.V. test to the shortlisted candidates will be uploaded in the Website of OPSC well before the date of Viva Voce test. The candidates are required to download their Intimation Letter from the Website of the Commission. No separate Intimation Letter will be sent to the candidate.

1. Scheme of examination.

The competitive examination shall comprise as follows namely-

- i) Written Examination (Compulsory and Optional) - 300 Marks
- ii) Career Weightage - 100 Marks
- iii) Viva Voce Test - 50 Marks

2. Subjects and syllabi for the competitive examination are mentioned at Annexure-I to VI.

3. The written test shall consist of 02 papers i.e. one Compulsory Paper and one Optional Paper. The subject in which the candidate shall be tested in the examination and the maximum mark for each paper is given below:-

4. The Compulsory Paper shall be of Degree standard and shall consist of 150 Multiple Choice Questions each carrying one mark. The detailed syllabus is at Annexure-I.

5. The Optional subject paper for the examination shall be of Master's Degree Standard and the syllabi are detailed at Annexure – II to VI. The examination for Optional Subject shall be subjective in nature.

6. The Commission shall evaluate the academic career marks of the candidates from HSC or equivalent examination to Post Graduate examination as under :-
